Dear Fellow Traveller.

On Wednesday Theresa May invoked Article 50 of the Lisbon Treaty, formally triggering Britain's departure from the EU. Discussions are ongoing about concepts relating to soft boarder or hard border and the effects Brexit will/may have on "our little Green Isle"., north and south of the border.

Clearly, the departure constitutes a watershed. But what kind? And how will it look in historical perspective? Is this a moment akin to 1534, when the Church of England separated from the authority of Rome? Or 1806, when Napoleon declared the Continental System, blockading British commerce? Or 1940, when British forces retreated pell-mell from Dunkirk? Evidently, it is not like any of those.

Early in my priesthood I knew a elderly gentleman who fought in the Boar War (1899-1905) and in the First World (1914-18) as a foot soldier and remarkably lived to tell the tale. I used to visit him with Holy Communion on the him on First Fridays. I remember asking him what he thought about the E.E.C. (Ireland and Britain joined in 1073), his reply was that it was a good thing - "it will stop the War!". He believed that as long as people are talking and trying to work together they are unlikely to fight. He reminded me that Europe was always at war - He knew his history.

Mrs May has said that we are "leaving [the EU] but we are not leaving Europe." She said Britain wants to be Europe's best friend. - I am reminded of a child who says you are my "best friend" but refuses to play with me!

The Brexit decision is indicative of what seems a worrying trend. Mr Trump in the U.S.A. is talking about "building a wall" to keep people out. This tendency to build walls and keep people out is a long way from the Gospel. During past week a 17year old teenager from Libya was found clinging on to a piece of wreckage in the Mediterranean - - it seems he was the only survivor from a group of 143 people who had set out from Libya three days previously hoping to make land in Italy. The news didn't ever make the front page! Couple that with the thousands of Syrians trying to escape the killing in Aleppo. Does the world care any more?

I know we are only a tiny country in the global scheme of things but we must be careful not to yield to the temptation - "I'm all right Jack,

and too bad about the rest!".

As we approach Holy Week I am thinking ... - It all seems a long way from the Gospel of Jesus Christ! What should our response to it all be?
