Preparations for The World Meeting of Families 2018 are hotting up.

As you know there will be a number of different elements of the WMOF2018 which include

- (i) A National Opening in each diocese;
- (ii) A Pastoral Congress from 22-24 Aug (R.D.S. Dublin);
- (iii) the Festival of Families on 25 August - (Croke Park);
- (iv) the Closing Mass on Sunday 26 August in Phoenix Park.

"The WMOF2018 has also rolled out the 'Amoris: Let's Talk Family!

Let's be Family' programme which is a conversation about the family with an emphasis on Pope Francis' teaching and reflections. The World Meeting of Families promises to be an occasion that will reflect on the faith experience of families from many parts of the world as well as on the challenges and celebrations which characterise the ups and downs of day-to-day family life". Few things:

- ⇒ The full itinerary of the Popes visit to Ireland will be announced tomorrow Monday June 11th. (Rumours about Knock are just rumours as of now).
- ⇒ People are asked to help financially with the expenses associated with the visit. Some parishes are holding "Second Collections" next Sunday. In keeping with our regular practice in this parish, the contribution to this Special Church Collection" will be met from regular basket/Offertory collection. If we all put a little extra into the Offertory Collection there will be no need to hold a separate funding raising activity. Salthill Parish contribution will be €5,000.
- ⇒ Salthill Parish is looking at having a bus going to the Mass in the Phoenix Park on the Sunday Aug 26th. If interested contact the Parish Office.
- ⇒ It looks like people attending the Mass will need to be fit enough to walk 5kms. No tickets for the Phoenix Park available yet. Parish Office for info
- ⇒ Gardai have put a limit of 600,000 so tickets will be necessary.
