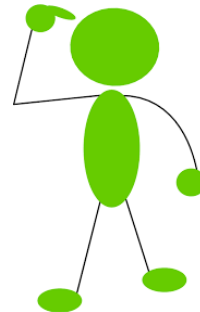
Dear Fellow Traveller,
