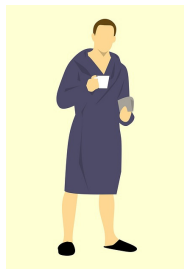
This week's thought comes by way of a kind parishioner who spotted the following piece on Google "Daily Curio" .— Thanks Frank ! Why we want things we don't need

Have you ever upgraded one piece of clothing and ended up replacing your entire wardrobe? If so, you've experienced the "Diderot effect". Named after the 18th-century French philosopher Denis Diderot, the Diderot effect describes how making one change in the search for happiness can lead to a landslide of changes which still don't make you happy.

The story goes that Diderot lived a penniless existence in a house full of books, always on the verge of destitution while focusing on his writings. When a fan of his—who happened to be the Russian Empress Catherine the Great—heard the philosopher was in especially desperate need of money, she decided to help. Catherine purchased his entire library, hired him as her personal librarian, and paid him 25 years of salary upfront. Diderot used his newfound fortune to purchase an exquisite scarlet writing robe, so as to enhance his philosophizing. And here is where Diderot's trouble began. The splendour of his new garment made his writing desk look old and tired. After purchasing a finely crafted new one, his armchair looked out of place. A leather replacement was arranged. The prints on the wall were now sad and boring. He purchased new ones. The robe also made the rest of his clothes look tattered and old. A tailor was happy to make him all new ones. Soon Diderot was in so much debt that he was back to being financially insolvent.

Diderot's experience eventually led him to compose his most famous work, *Regrets for my Old Dressing Gown*. In it, he chronicles being captured by the grips of materialism, and how it only made him unhappy. The Diderot Effect is still used in psychology and sociology to explain the pitfalls of modern society. A cautionary tale for all of us. Or, as the Dalai Lama says, "want what you have"!
