"The Vision of Christ" hangs on the wall near as you enter the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. It is executed in "Marquetry" — a blending of timbers, in this case mainly Irish. It was created by Brian Murray, Portumna. The main background is of Irish Oak, Beech, Elm & Ash while the detail includes pieces of Burr, Rosewood, Maple, Walnut, Yew and Satinwood. It is a fine example of the use of different woods coming together that make this great image possible. A very different work of art from the more traditional crucifixion scene but equally striking and effective in its own right.

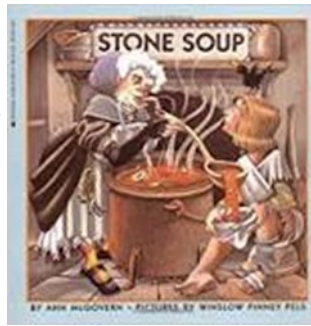

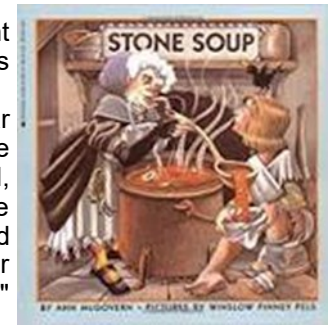
