Hope you are enjoying the gentle relaxation of some of the restrictions we observed for the past few months. Meeting people again is good for the soul! It is good to have people at Mass again. We continue to observe government guidelines, - we have two "Pods" – total of 100 at any one Mass, (Funerals and weddings 25).

Weekday Mass 10am - no need to preregister/Book

Weekend Mass (Saturday 5:30 Vigil, Sunday 9:30, 11;, 12:30; 6p.m.) Please book. Christmas Masses: We are suggesting that people to come to Church for One Mass as a family over the Christmas period – Dec 24<sup>th</sup>- Jan 3<sup>rd</sup>. All Masses on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, St. Stephens Day and Sunday Dec 27 need to pre-booked. We can only accommodate 100 per Mass though we have seating for 800. We will have a Lottery and Tickets for over subscribed Masses. In total we will have over 20 Christmas Masses over the holiday period. People are asked wear masks, observe social distancing and not to congregate outside the church either before or after Mass. Most important to remember to stay at home if you have any symptoms or Covid or of the Flu or are self-isolating. We invite people to join us on the Web-cam (sallthillparish.ie) for any Mass

Monday to Saturday Dec 28 – Jan 2<sup>nd</sup> Mass daily at 11am - (Just for this week!). A Flyer will be distributed this week with details of Christmas arrangements.

Advent: John the Baptist is the primary focus of today's Mass. He came to prepare the minds of people for the coming of Christ. God sends the message of salvation and meaningful living to us through each other. St Paul once asked: "How can people know about God if they have never heard about him? Jesus found his first disciples among the circle of the Baptist's followers. John taught the value of self-control and of prayer, and urged them to listen to the inner voice of God in their hearts. The high point of John's short ministry was meeting with Jesus. As well as baptising Jesus, he encouraged

some of his own followers to join the Jesus movement. It was through the John the Baptist that Andrew and his brother Peter, and Philip and Nathanael became apostles. Each of us can help other people to know and love God.. In all sorts of ways, people are in position to influence others, for good or ill.

It is this God who comes to us in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. John the Baptist refers to Jesus as "more powerful than I am. He gives full expression to God's tender love that brings healing to the broken, strength to the weak and rest to the weary. It is this adult Jesus, now risen Lord, whose coming towards us and present to us that we celebrate at Christmas. The Baptist calls us this Advent to prepare a way in our lives for the coming of this Lord, in whom mercy and faithfulness have met, justice and peace have embraced. (Responsorial Psalm). This is the God whom we seek this Advent, who can give us meaning and peace.
