Dear Fellow Traveller,

Welcome Back. Great to have people in church for Mass again. We propose to reopen gently, gradually look at the new reality and address the issues as they arise. Many of the restrictions that have been in place since the beginning of the year have been eased but the Health Service Executive says that the public must be vigilant because Covid-19 may still pose a threat. Personal responsibility and proper behaviour will keep us safe. Let us be optimistic.. Pope Francis reminds us in a recent message that our future is built “not in isolation, but rather in community (with each other) and in harmony (with the natural world)”. Many people have received the vaccine, which is working, and the number of sick people in hospital with Covid is down.
