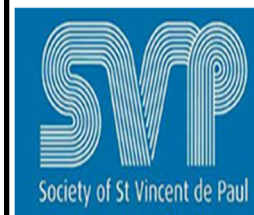

Dear Fellow Traveller,

Our parish has been meticulous in providing safe and secure locations for its services, in addition to complying with all the official requirements connected with lock-down and restrictions relating to Covid 19. Huge thanks to all our Parishioners for your co-operation, support, patience and understanding. Special “Thank You” to all those involved in acting as Ushers, Cleaners, ministers to the housebound and nursing homes, flowers, Readers, Sacristy Grounds, Key holders etc. We appreciate all who continue to support the parish financially both in terms of weekly donations in the bucket on Sundays, direct donations, standing orders etc. We are managing to keep the bills paid, and are slowly getting back to what we are about. That said, churches have been greatly effected both in practise and custom.

The priority is to keep people safe and well. Some recent decisions are difficult to understand. Take Baptism as a prime example. The Church has been advise not to have Baptisms in Church. An implied reason for this is that families and their friends might have a celebration afterwards which might be an occasion for the virus to spread. Contrast this to major sports events, concerts etc. which are currently allowed to take place, they are not shut down because some of the fans may gather in significant groups to celebrate afterwards.

During the week there was a very interesting decision handed down by the High Court where it decided that CCTV evidence could be produced in court. The defence lawyers had argued that the mass retention of mobile phone data, showing the locations of phones, and incoming and outgoing calls and texts, was a breach of privacy rights guaranteed under the European Charter on Fundamental Rights. The court decided that the common good must be paramount over possible privacy rights of the individual.

.. Last week marked the end of the War of Independence when the “Irish Republican Army” and the British government signed a peace treaty that led eventually to the establishment of our nation and shaped the life we who live in this country now have.

Decisions we make in life effect the individual and the community in which we live. We are involved with each other. People who decide not to take the vaccine or to wear face masks for example is a case in point where individual actions may have an effect on a fellow citizen who has equal rights.

John Donne put it this way in his famous poem
*“ No person is an island entire of itself;
every one is a piece of the continent,
a part of the main;
any person’s death diminishes me,
because I am involved in human kind.
And therefore never look to know
for whom the bell tolls;
it tolls for thee”.*

Jesus puts it this way *“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. And you shall love your neighbour as yourself On these two depend the whole of the Law and the Prophets”*

Have a Good week, take care of yourselves
and take care of each other.
